This report has been compiled by Fides Advisory Services Ltd, T/A Networks Anonymous. Networks Anonymous was appointed to provide an independent competition analysis report to comply with Regulation 11(4)(a) and requirement 9.2 of Form G of the “Regulations on processes and procedures in terms of the Electronic Communications Act” as specified in Government Gazette Number 39871, published on the 30th of March 2016 (as amended).

This report provides an analysis of the possible market effects of the proposed transfer of Individual Electronic Communications Network Service licence (#0328/IECNS/MAR/09) and Individual Electronic Communications Service Licence (#0328/IECS/MAR/09) held by WebDev CC (the Applicant) to OptiPulse (Pty) Ltd (the “Transferee”).

Methodological approach used for this report

The methodology used in this report follows the guidance to defining markets and assessing competition as outlined by the Independent Communications Authority of South Africa (the “Authority” or “ICASA”) in its “Guideline for Conducting Market Reviews” published on the 8th of March 2010 and the 2018 Findings document on Priority Markets.¹

Impact of this transaction on competition

Networks Anonymous finds the following:

- 1) The Applicant is currently dormant meaning that any licence transfer shall increase the level of competition in any market the Transferee chooses to operate;
- 2) The Transferee’s shareholders are currently purchasing services in Market R3 and R4, yet its shareholders’ clients require full ownership of connectivity provision, which is only possible through the holding of an I-ECNS and I-ECS licences;
- 3) The proposed licence transfer has no impact on existing operators in existing markets and is not likely to have any impact on the current level of competition in any markets as defined by ICASA.
- 4) The transfer of the licences will support the growth of the Transferee’s shareholders’ operations, thereby supporting the objectives of the National Cloud and Data Policy.

1. Introduction

This report has been compiled by Fides Advisory Services Ltd T/A Networks Anonymous as an independent competition analysis report to comply with Regulation 11(4)(a) and requirement 9.2 of Form G of the “Regulations on processes and procedures in terms of the Electronic Communications Act” as specified in Government Gazette Number 39871, published on the 30th of March 2016 (as amended)

This report provides an analysis of the possible market effects of the proposed transfer of the Individual Electronic Communications Network Service licence (#0328/IECNS/MAR/09) and Individual Electronic Communications Service Licence (#0328/IECS/MAR/09) held by WebDev CC (the Applicant) to OptiPulse (Pty) Ltd (the “Transferee”).

2. Parties to the licence transfer

2.1. The Applicant

The Applicant, WebDev CC, holds an Individual Electronic Communications Network Service Licence (#0328/IECNS/MAR/09) and Individual Electronic Communications Services Licence (#0328/IECS/MAR/09). According to information provided by the parties to this transaction, the Applicant currently offers no services and is, for the purposes of this assessment, a dormant entity.

2.2. The Transferee

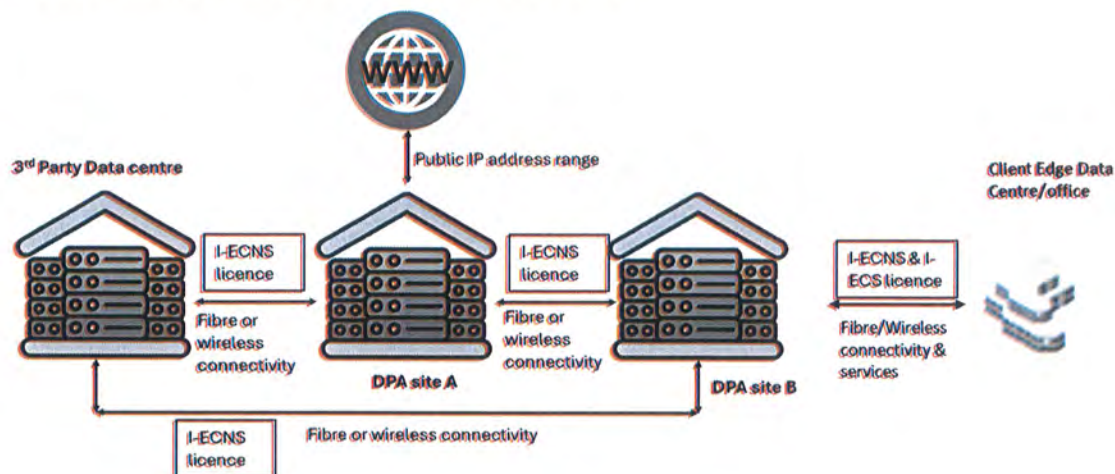
The Transferee, OptiPulse (Pty) Ltd, through its shareholders, operates a modular data centre with current capacity of 2 000m² (with the potential for expansion to 9000 m²). Through this facility, the Transferee’s shareholders offers carrier neutral peering, data transfer and other traditional data centre services. The Transferee’s shareholders also provide technical solutions in the development of Edge Data Centre solutions, data centre technical operations and maintenance expertise, fibre connectivity and other services through commercial relationships with Internet Service Providers.

2.3. Why the Transferee seeks a licence

Historically, data centre operators were able to procure network connectivity services from different licensees so as to connect multiple data centre sites as well as install specific connection infrastructure at the client premises. However, many of today’s data centre clients are focussed on increased security requirements and require data centre providers such as the Transferee to own and operate the connectivity infrastructure between data centre sites.

According to current legislative requirements, the Transferee requires an I-ECNS licence to provide the Layer 1 and Layer 2 services that clients require between datacentres and I-ECS licence to provide Layer 3 connectivity between the data centre and specific client sites. The figure below illustrates where the Transferee seeks a licence in order to meet client and market requirements:

Figure 2-1: Identifying where the Transferee seeks a licence

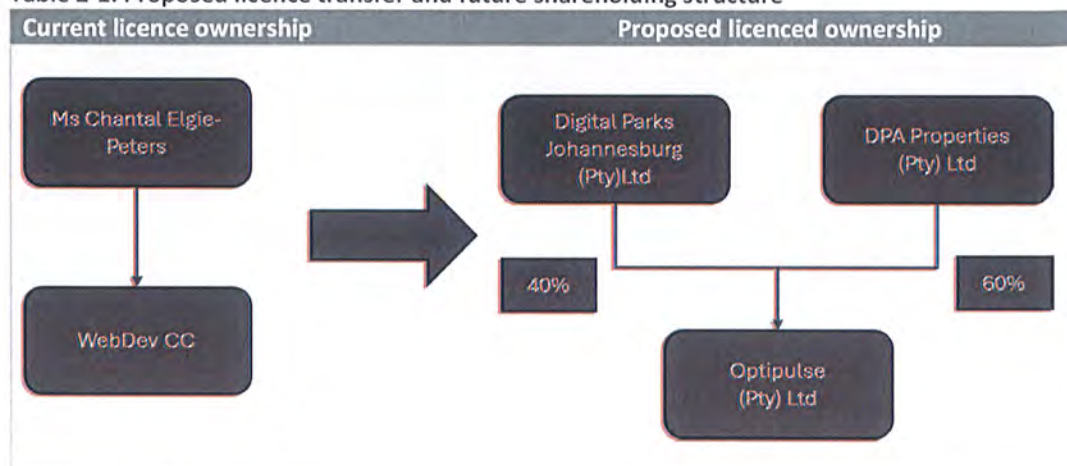

The figure above confirms the intention of the Transferee: to provide the connectivity requirements of the shareholder assets, namely the data centre in Samrand, Centurion, Gauteng.

3. The policy environment

This proposed transfer falls under the prescripts of the Electronic Communications Act, 2005 as amended, as well as the Presidential Report for the 4th Industrial Revolution² and the National Cloud & Data Policy³.

Particularly, the National Cloud and Data Policy states the following: "*it may not be feasible for the government to own and manage data centres*" (page 19). This statement obliges all organs of state to facilitate the construction and operation of datacentres by the private sector in order to meet government demand for cloud and data services.

The proposed transfer of this licence meets the above obligation, subject to the identification of any negative competition impacts.

4. Methodology to assess the impact of this transaction on competition

This section of the report outlines the methodology applied to:

- Define the market or markets that may be affected by the change in control; and
- The potential impact this change in control may have on competition in the market or markets.

4.1. Market definition

The correct definition of the market is crucial to determine the impact this application may have on the South African electronic communications markets. The following documents have been used as reference points to guide the methodology used in this report:

- Electronic Communications Act, no. 36 of 2005, where Chapter Eight of the Act outlines certain steps and factors that the Authority must follow when defining markets;
- The Authority's "Guideline to Conducting Market Reviews"⁴ which provides a more detailed list of factors to be considered when assessing the level of effective competition in a market;
- The Call Termination Market Reviews of 2010⁵ and 2014⁶ which provide practical examples as to how the Authority has approached defining markets;
- The National Integrated ICT Policy White Paper (the White Paper) published in Government Gazette Number 40325 on the 3rd of October 2016. The White Paper defines the following markets:
 - *International segment: The international market includes undersea cables and satellite.*
 - *Backbone infrastructure: the backbone infrastructure market is the network that connects the cities, towns and villages.*
 - *Metro infrastructure: The metro network is a regional network comprising a number of interconnected aggregation/switching centres.*
 - *Last Mile (local loop) infrastructure: The White Paper segments this into two markets:*
 - *Fibre-based last mile broadband market*
 - *Wireless last mile broadband market*⁷

3. The relevant market shares of each party
4. Potential barriers to competition in the market that may prevent other licensees from competing against the Applicant or the Transferee;
5. Financial considerations of both parties to the transaction, such as Assets and Liabilities (to test against the Competition Commission Guidelines for the size of any merger or acquisition);
6. How end-users are to receive services; and
7. The geographic scope of services.

The information received from the Applicant and Transferee is then compared to information available from other sources, including ICASA's various "State of the ICT Sector" reports (available at: <https://www.icasa.org.za/pages/sector-forecasting>), Annual Financial Statements of operators, media reports and direct engagement with industry players.

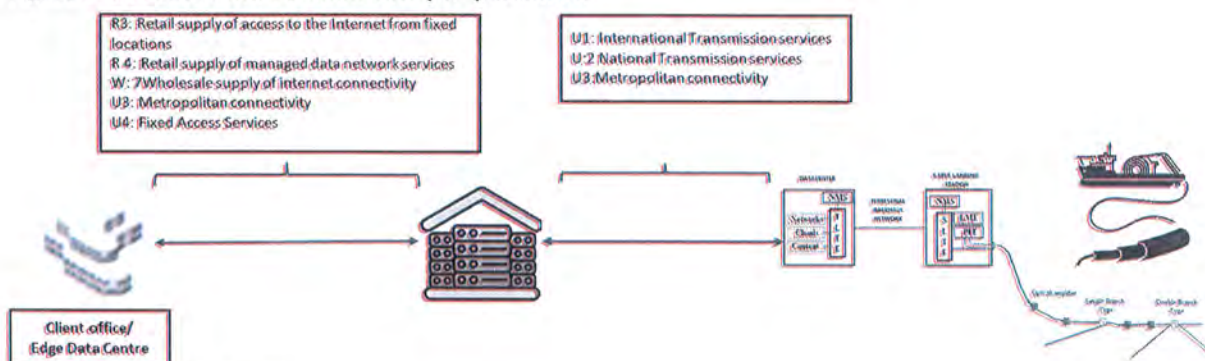
5. Assessing the impact of the application on competition in the relevant market

The figure above shows that a data centre provides a pivotal role in connecting a business to both high volumes of data as well as access to the World Wide Web but also illustrates the reliance on the existence and availability of fairly priced connectivity services across the entire value chain.

As the table illustrates, the Transferee's main shareholder competes against a host of data centre operators. The ability to provide a complete connectivity solution provides the Transferee's shareholders with a new selling point in the market, enhancing its competitive position.

5.3. Identifying the markets where the applicant and the transferee are present

5.3.1. Markets where the Applicant operates

The Applicant is dormant and does not offer any services in the ICASA-defined markets, does not hold any numbering ranges or radio frequency spectrum licences. Therefore the Applicant does not have any presence in the markets defined by ICASA.

5.3.2. Markets where the Transferee operates

The Transferee does not provide any services. Rather, its shareholders purchase services in the various markets. Table 5-2 below indicates the markets in which the Transferee shareholders purchase services from licensees and those markets the Transferee intends to enter:

The Transferee shareholders are currently wholly dependent on existing licensees for services across the connectivity value chain. The intention is for the Transferee to commence the provision of these services in order to meet the requirements of business customers (as outlined in Section 2.3).

5.4. Markets which may be affected by this application

The four markets most directly affected by this application are the:

- R3: Retail supply of access to the internet from fixed locations; and
- R4: Retail supply of managed data network services
- W7: Wholesale supply of internet connectivity
- U3: Metropolitan connectivity

5.4.1. Market R3: Retail supply of access to the internet from fixed locations

The ICASA report indicates there were 2.7 million fixed broadband subscriptions in South Africa as of September 2024. However, an industry analysis firm forecasts that there were 3.6 million active FTTH customers alone in December 2024, indicating that the market for fixed services may be much larger than ICASA's estimates.

The Applicant has no customers in this market whilst the Transferee will need to lease or deploy new infrastructure in order to compete in this market. Therefore the licence transfer will have no impact overall nature of competition in this market, but will give the Transferee an opportunity to expand its growth horizons.

5.4.2. Market R4: Retail supply of managed data network services

The Transferee does not provide any managed data network services, but intends to commence such services, specifically to the Transferee shareholders' single data centre. This is in stark contrast to the number of ISPs serviced by Business Connexion (Telkom Group), Teraco and the Internet Exchange Points operated by the Internet Service Providers Association of South Africa, which serve all major ISPs in the South African market.

For example, Teraco's JB4 facility is the largest standalone data centre built in Africa with 80 000m² of building structure, serviced by 80MW of utility power supply, providing 50MW of critical IT power load. The datacentre operated by the Transferee shareholders operates a data centre of 2 000m.²

The Business plan of the Transferee indicates the intention to only provide such services to those commercial end-users who directly connect to the Samrand data centre. This is in stark contrast to the number of commercial end-users served by competitor vertically integrated data centre providers (such as BCX, MTN Business, Vodacom and NTT).

5.4.3. Wholesale and Upstream markets

The Transferee seeks to provide fixed access and metro connectivity services directly so as to meet the requirements for data centre connectivity (as outlined in Section 2.3 and 2.4). Crucially, ICASA prioritised the metro connectivity and wholesale fixed access markets for investigation regarding the potential for anti-competitive behaviour (see page 45 of the ICASA Findings Document on Priority Markets).

The Transferee intends to utilise the licences in question to respond to pricing and market pressures from existing network and service licensees purely for connectivity to its shareholders' data centre as well as meet client requirements (as outlined in Section 2.3). Given the relative scale of the existing data centre to direct competitors in the market, the Transferee's entry to the market will most likely have an insignificant impact on any of the wholesale and upstream markets.

6. Concluding statement

The Applicant is dormant and does not provide any services. The Transferee is a new entrant in response to the need of its shareholders' clients. The Transferee faces significant market entry challenges rather than being able to impose any competitive pressure on existing licensee operations. Therefore, the proposed licence transfer has no discernible impact on competition but represents growth opportunities for the Transferee. The proposed transfer also meets the goals of the National Cloud and Data policy by creating a positive environment for private sector investment in cloud and data infrastructure.

Executive Summary

This report has been compiled by Fides Advisory Services Ltd T/A Networks Anonymous as an independent consumer analysis report to comply with Regulation 11(4)(b) and requirement 9.3 of Form G of the “Regulations on processes and procedures in terms of the Electronic Communications Act” as specified in Government Gazette Number 39871, published on the 30th of March 2016, as amended.

This report provides an analysis of the possible market effects of the proposed transfer of Individual Electronic Communications Network Service licence (#0328/IECNS/MAR/09) and Individual Electronic Communications Service Licence (#0328/IECS/MAR/09) held by WebDev CC (the Applicant) to OptiPulse (Pty) Ltd (the “Transferee”).

Methodological approach used for this report

The methodology used to assess the impact this licence transfer may have on consumer interests encompasses the following:

- 1) The requirements under the End-user and Subscriber Service Charter Regulations published in Government Gazette 39898 and amended by Government Gazette 41613;
- 2) The impact of this transfer for existing end-users of the Applicant and the Transferee; and
- 3) The impact of this transfer on broad consumer interests.

Impact of this transaction on consumer interests

This transaction represents a key recognition of the need for data centre operators to offer high-value connectivity services. The Transferee, whose shareholders operate data centres, seeks to acquire a licence so as to deploy the necessary Layer 1, Layer 2 and Layer 3 services to support high-capacity, high-security and low latency connectivity from datacentre to datacentre as well as between datacentre and key high-volume clients.

The proposed licence transfer is in line with the recommendations and expectations of the Presidential Commission on the Fourth Industrial Revolution (issued on the 23rd of October 2020) as well as the National Cloud and Data Policy (issued on the 31st of May 2024).

Based on information received from both the Applicant and the Transferee, Networks Anonymous finds the following:

- The proposed licence transfer supports the goals of the National Cloud and Data Policy;
- There is no impact on any subscribers of the Applicant;
- Existing Transferee subscribers are not affected by this transaction; and
- Transferee subscribers shall benefit from increased redundancy and quality of service of data centre services as well as increased choice

In conclusion, the proposed licence transfer has no impact on the Applicant (it has no subscribers), provides the opportunity for enhanced connectivity to existing clients of the Transferee’s shareholders and represents achievement of the goals of the National Cloud and Data Policy. Therefore, the proposed transfer is expected to provide both direct benefits to subscribers as well as socio-economic benefits of a more inter-connected fabric of data centres across South Africa.

1. Rationale for this report

Fides Advisory Services T/A Networks have compiled this report to provide an independent review of the impact the transfer of a licence from one party to another may have on the interests of consumers regarding the provision of electronic communications network services and electronic communications services.

The report is submitted as per requirement by the Independent Communications Authority of South Africa's (the Authority) requirements under Regulation 11(4)(b) of the "Regulations on processes and procedures in terms of the Electronic Communications Act" Form G, point 9.3 as specified in Government Gazette Number 39871, published on the 30th of March 2016.

2. The parties to this licence transfer application

2.1. The Applicant

The Applicant, WebDev CC, holds an Individual Electronic Communications Network Service Licence (#0328/IECNS/MAR/09) and Individual Electronic Communications Services Licence (#0328/IECS/MAR/09). According to information provided by the parties to this transaction, the Applicant currently offers no services and is effectively dormant.

2.2. The Transferee

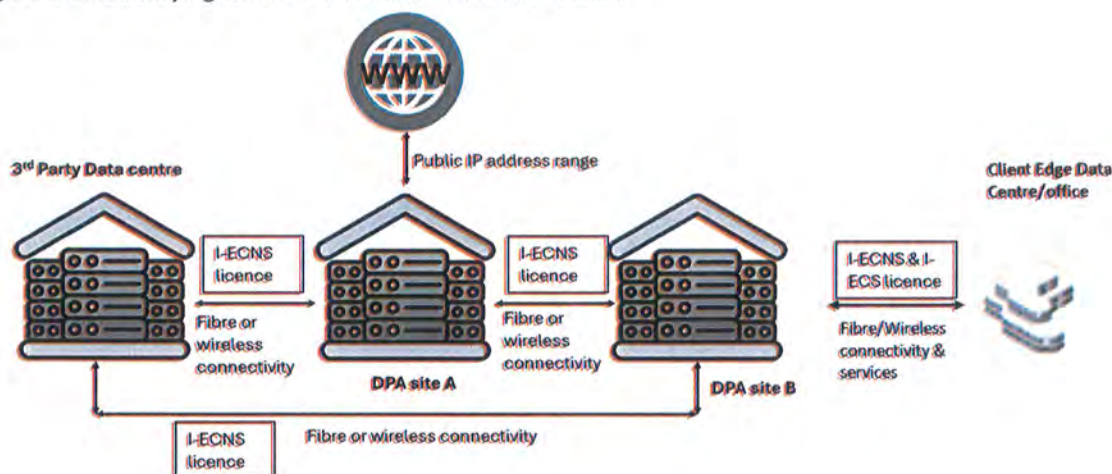
The Transferee, OptiPulse (Pty) Ltd, through its shareholders, operates a modular data centre with current capacity of 2000 square metres, with the potential for expansion to 9000 square metres. Through this facility, the Transferee's shareholders offers carrier neutral peering, data transfer and other traditional data centre services. The Transferee's shareholders also provides technical solutions in the development of Edge Data Centre solutions, data centre technical operations and maintenance expertise, fibre connectivity and other services through commercial relationships with Internet Service Providers.

2.3. Why does the Transferee seek an I-ECNS licence and I-ECS licence?

Historically, data centre operators were able to procure network connectivity services from different licensees so as to connect multiple data centre sites as well as install specific connection infrastructure at the client premises. However, many of today's data centre clients are focussed on increased security requirements and require data centre providers such as the Transferee to own and operate the connectivity infrastructure between data centre sites.

According to current legislative requirements, the Transferee requires an I-ECNS licence to provide the Layer 1 and Layer 2 services that clients require between datacentres and I-ECS licence to provide Layer 3 connectivity between the data centre and specific client sites. The figure below illustrates where OptiPulse seeks a licence in order to meet client and market requirements:

3. The policy environment

This proposed transfer falls under the prescripts of the Electronic Communications Act, 2005 as amended, as well as the Presidential Report for the 4th Industrial Revolution¹ and the National Cloud & Data Policy².

Particularly, the National Cloud and Data Policy states the following: "it may not be feasible for the government to own and manage data centres" (page 19). This statement obliges all organs of state to facilitate the construction and operation of datacentres by the private sector in order to meet government demand for cloud and data services.

The proposed transfer of this licence meets the above obligation, subject to the identification of any negative social impacts.

4. Methodology to determine the impact on end-users

This section outlines the methodology to determine the impact this transfer may have on consumer interests by considering the following:

- 1) The requirements under the End-user and Subscriber Service Charter Regulations published in Government Gazette 39898 and amended by Government Gazette 41613;
- 2) The impact of this transfer for existing end-users of the Applicant and the Transferee;
- 3) The impact of this transfer on broad consumer interests; and
- 4) Alignment with existing government policies

4.1. Methodology to assess the impact of this transfer on end-users of the Applicant

This segment of the methodology aims to identify what would happen to existing end-users of the Applicant if the transfer were to be successful. End-users of the Applicant may experience a range of issues, including:

- 1) Will the existing service remain available?
- 2) Will the end-user receive lower or increased prices post the transfer?
- 3) Will the end-user receive the same, worse or better quality of service from the Transferee compared to the existing Quality of Service it receives from the Applicant?
- 4) Will the end-user have access to a greater or less range of future Electronic Communications Services if the transfer were to be approved?
- 5) Will the end-user be adversely affected by any billing and accounts migration process?

The method followed to answer these questions is to issue a questionnaire directly to the Applicant for completion.

4.2. Methodology to assess the impact of this transfer on end-users of the Transferee

This segment of the methodology aims to assess the impact of the transfer on the Transferee's end-users. Any person seeking a licence through a licence transfer may be intending to:

- 1) Enter the market for the type of licence considered in the transfer: does the Transferee have the expertise to operate and manage the services that the Transferee has in operation?
- 2) Acquire a network with greater geographic reach: does the Transferee exhibit the capacity to maintain and operate a larger network?
- 3) Acquire a customer base: will a growing customer base have any negative consequences on existing customers of the Transferee through billing errors, reduction in Quality of Service, increased fees or a reduction in the suite of services currently on offer?
- 4) Enhanced consumer service: does the transfer lead to an increase in the Quality of Service, range of services or complaints management procedures of existing clients of the Transferee?

The method followed to answer these questions is to issue a questionnaire directly to the Transferee for completion.

4.3. Methodology to assess the impact of this transfer on broad consumer welfare

The transfer of a licence may be beneficial to the consumer body if, amongst others:

- 1) The Transferee offers services to an under-served area and/or increases choice for consumers;
- 2) The services the Transferee intends to offer indicate technological evolution (e.g. from ADSL to fibre connectivity);
- 3) The Transferee offers an innovative bundle of products and services; and
- 4) The proposed transfer supports broader government objectives under existing government policies.

The method followed to answer these questions is to issue a questionnaire directly to the Applicant for completion as well as a comparison with existing offerings available from different network operators.

5. The impact of this transfer on consumer interests

5.1. The impact on consumers of the Applicant

The Applicant is dormant with no services on offer or subscribers. Therefore there is no concern regarding consumer welfare from this perspective of the transfer application.

5.2. The impact on consumers of the Transferee

The transfer of the licences will grant the Transferee the ability to deploy and operate the necessary network infrastructure to meet the requirements of its shareholders' existing subscriber base as well as future subscribers. This right to deploy and operate infrastructure will lead to an improvement in a range of Quality of Service metrics, including levels of redundancy; cost-competitiveness, latency and others.

Therefore the proposed licence transfer shall provide a benefit to the Transferee's shareholders' existing client base.

5.3. The impact on broad consumer welfare


Broad consumer welfare shall increase if all consumers in total will feel the benefit of any particular action. The proposed transaction supports the objective of the National Cloud & Data Policy (to expand the availability and improve the quality of service on offer from data centres in South Africa). Therefore it is expected that, over time, all of South Africa shall benefit by data centre operators being able to provide connectivity infrastructure better and more directly in line with subscriber requirements.

6. Conclusion

Through a review of all the information provided, there is no evidence of consumers being negatively affected by this application. Rather, the information provided illustrates that existing and future subscribers of the Transferee's shareholders will experience an increase in Quality of Service and the goals of increased private sector construction of data centres may be achieved, as per the National Cloud and Data policy.




