		National and Provincial Elections Broadcasting Regulations, 2014, as amended (the "Elections Regulations"), an aggrieved individual may lodge a complaint with the CCC within 5 days of such a broadcast and further that, in terms of Regulation 6 of the CCC Regulations, such a matter must be treated as urgent.		
	4.4.	Council was informed that following the conclusion of the national elections, the elections monitors would be reviewing all the elections broadcasting content to ensure that all the parties involved complied with the regulations. Non-compliant parties would be reported to the CCC by the Licensing and Compliance Division.		
	4.5.	Council requested that the CCC Coordinator should align the Council submission memorandum with the CCC judgement, specifically section (a) - (f) of the memorandum.		
	4.6.	Council sought clarity regarding the definition of <i>locus standi</i> . Council was informed that <i>locus standi</i> is the Latin term for a right to bring a matter before a court or a tribunal.
