	12.2 It was recommended that Council should approve the Application for the DAB+ trial Radio Frequency Spectrum Licence for a period of 8 months for the following reasons:	
	12.2.1 The trial aims to benefit users and the public by introducing a new technology system that combines cloud and server-based technology. The technology would offer users excellent audio performance, service accessibility, and security. Therefore, the application is in line with Regulation 40 as it would enable new and different ways of using the radio frequency spectrum.

	12.5 Council remarked that the Authority should commence with the process of licensing Digital Broadcasting Services.	
	12.6 Management informed Council that there is no provision in the Radio Frequency Spectrum Regulations, 2015 ("Regulations") that allows the Authority to charge fees for a trial licence. Management further informed Council that the Authority receives two reports on each trial, namely the Mid-Term Report and the Final Report as stipulated in the Regulations.	
	12.7 Management further informed Council that there is a structure within the Engineering and Technology Division which is working towards the implementation of the Regulations, which will in turn allow the Licensing and Compliance Division to begin the process of licensing Digital Audio Broadcasting Services.

Comments made:

- 14.4. Council was informed that the CCC heard the matter on the basis that the contravention occurred when ODM was still a licensee.
- 14.5. Council sought clarity on why the fines for regulation 5 were more substantial than the fines with regard to the other regulations. Council was informed that the process of the calculations was outlined in the CCC judgement (page 33). Council raised its concerns with imposing fines on an entity which is no longer a licensee. It was clarified that CCC heard the complaint on the basis that the alleged contraventions occurred during the period when the license was still valid.
- 14.6. Council was informed that ODM has already been issued with a letter to cease operations by the Licencing and Compliance Division since their license expired and they did not submit a licence renewal application and that this process is unrelated to the CCC process.
- 14.7. Council was also informed that until the fines are settled, the entity will not be allowed to apply for a licence renewal.
- 14.8. The Committee informed Council that in respect of contravention Regulation 6(2) of the Local Television Content Regulations 2016, the respondent failed to ensure that a minimum of 15% of their total annual channel acquisition budget, measured across its service as a whole, is spent on channels with local television content that are compiled and up linked from South Africa
- 14.9. Council sought clarity on whether its decision on this matter could be deferred. Council was informed that the matter was timebound due to turnaround times in terms of CCC processes.
- 14.10. Council was informed of a meeting between ICASA and the entity on Monday 3 June 2024 to discuss its licence renewal matter.
