1. Terms of Reference

- 1.1. It is the intention of the Independent Communication Authority of South Africa ("ICASA") to licence the Wireless Open Access Network (WOAN) and International Mobile Telecommunications ("IMT") Spectrum in the identified frequency bands in 700 MHz, 2600 MHz and 3500 MHz as outlined in regulation 7 read with regulations 2(1)(c) and 2(1)(f) of the Radio Frequency Spectrum Regulations ("RFSR") published in Government Gazette No. 38641 (Notice 279 of 2015) dated 30 March 2015, as amended.
- 1.2. ICASA seeks to appoint a Company and/or Consultant (Bidder) that will assist it with the following:
 - 1.2.1. Conduct a comparative scoring analysis of the Demand, Need and Support of the proposed service and the impact of the proposed service on competition in the relevant markets
 - 1.2.2. Conduct a qualitative and quantitative analysis of the economic efficiency as defined in the RFSR 2015, viability of the business plan and financial means of the as well as network rollout plans of all applicants and produce reports for each application.
 - 1.2.3. Assist with the preparation of the public hearings and analysis report in respect of the market research, financials, business plans, technical rollout plans, post hearing submissions and draft report on all applications.
 - 1.2.4. Advise the Authority on the impact and/or consequences of the proposed obligations on the respective applicants that are in consideration for licensing.

- 1.2.5. Draft reasons for decisions taken on each applicant in respect of the economic efficiency, financial viability and sustainability of the business plans and infrastructure rollout plans.
- 1.3. The service provider is expected to work closely with the project team to transfer knowledge to the project team in all the work done by the service provider. The service provider must conduct two (2) workshops with project team at initiation stage of the project (after submission of pre-hearing analysis report) and at conclusion of the project (after submission of final report).
- 1.4. In undertaking the tasks above, the appointed service provider/s will be required to take the following -amongst others into consideration:

 - 1.4.2. The relevant sections of the Electronic Communications Act (Act 36 of 2005), as amended ("the ECA");

 - 1.4.4. The Processes and Procedures Regulations for Induvial licences and Standard Terms and Conditions Regulations for Individual Licences (2010 Regulations and 2016 Regulations);
 - 1.4.5. The Radio Frequency Assignment Plans as outlined in the information memorandum published in Government Gazette Notice No.597 Gazette No. 42820 of 01 November 2019;
 - 1.4.6. The Promotion of Administration Justice Act, No. 3 of 2000 (PAJA); and
 - 1.4.7. The Radio Frequency Spectrum Regulations of 2015, as amended.
- 1.5. The licensing process to be followed for the WOAN is as outlined in the Processes and Procedures Regulations for Individual Licences together with the regulation 7 of the Radio Frequency Spectrum Regulations

2015 (published in terms of Government Gazette No 38641, Notice No. 279 of 2015).
