1. **PREFACE**

The Independent Communications Authority of South Africa (the Authority) has a

statutory mandate in terms of the Constitution¹, the ICASA Act², the Electronic

Communications Act3 (ECA) and the Broadcasting Act4 to regulate broadcasting

activities in South Africa in the public interest. One of the main tasks of the Authority,

is to ensure compliance by broadcasters with the terms and conditions of their licence,

and any relevant legislation and regulations.

The purpose of the report is intended to give a account of Radio Al Ansaar's

performance for the 2015/2016 financial year. Aspects of compliance that are

measured comprise of the Geographic Coverage, Community, Programming

Obligations, Complaints Received, Regulations on Code on People with Disabilities, South African Music Content Regulations and Regulations Regarding Standard Terms

and Conditions.

2. **BACKGROUND**

Radio Al Ansaar holds a Class Sound broadcasting service Licence⁵. The radio station's

mandate is to provide a sound broadcasting service to the Muslim community of

Durban area in the eThekwini Municipality in the KwaZulu Natal Province as set out

in the Licensee's frequency spectrum licence⁶.

3. COMPLIANCE ASSESSMENT

3.1 **Control Structure**

Clause 1 of the schedule to the licence states that:

"The Licence is issued to:

- 1.1 Name of Company/Entity: Al Ansaar Media Network.
- 1.2 Control of the Licensee: Control shall vest in the Board of Directors of a Section 21 Company known as Al Ansaar Media Network".

There were no changes reported by the Licensee to its control structure during the period under review. The Licensee is still Al -Ansaar Media Network and the control of the Licensee is in the hands of its Board of Trustees.

The Licensee's Board of Trustees that were elected on 08 April 2015 consists of following members:⁷

The Licensee is still male dominated constituting 69,2% and females 31%. The list of Board members of Al-Aansar Durban is similar to the list of the Board members of Al-Aansar Pietermaritzburg. Although Pietermaritzburg is not far from Durban, each Al-Aansar has its own licence. Thus this situation raises concerns fundamentally on the extent to which the community of Durban is involved in the decision making processes and or control of Al-Ansaar Durban.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with clauses 1.1 and 1.2 of the schedule to its licence.

3.2 Geographic Coverage Area

Clause 2 of the schedule to the licence stipulates that the radio station's geographic coverage area is as follows:

"Durban area in eThekwini Metropolitan Municipality in KwaZulu-Natal Province as set out in the Licensee's frequency spectrum licence".

The Licensee confirms that it covers the areas stipulated in its licence. This was confirmed during the monitoring exercise and thus was found to be compliant with clause 2 of the schedule to its licence.

3.3 Community

Clause 3.1 of the schedule to the licence states that:

"The Licensee shall provide services to a Muslim community residing within the geographic coverage area specified herein".

Radio Al -Ansaar Durban confirms that it provides sound broadcasting to the Muslim Community of interest in the Durban area.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with clause 3.1 of the schedule to its licence.

Clause 3.2 of the schedule to the licence stipulates that:

"The Licensee shall provide for the participation of community members in the affairs of the station in the following ways:

- 3.2.1 The Licensee shall hold at least two (2) general meetings annually with its community focusing on programming and programming policies of the station.
- 3.2.2 The Licensee shall furnish the Authority with proof of such meetings as well as the attendance thereof by members of the community.
- 3.2.3 The Licensee shall hold Annual General Meetings (AGM) for the following purposes:
- 3.2.3.1 To provide feedback on the Licensee's compliance with licence conditions,

3.2.3.2 To provide feedback on the Licensee's operational and financial performance, and any Special Annual General Meeting as and when required by the constitution; and

3.2.3.3 To elect members of the controlling structure, e.g. Board of Directors, Trustees etc. subject to the licensee's founding documents".

During the year under review, the Licensee states that two meetings were held with community focusing on programming and programming policies. The proof of the meetings were duly submitted by the Licensee. The Licensee's meetings with community were held on 30 March 2016 and 16 July 2016. Further, the Licensee held its AGM on 16 March 2016. During the AGM, the community members were provided with feedback on the Licensee's compliance with licensee conditions. Further, the community members were provided with feedback on the Licensee's operational and financial performance.8

The Licensee states that the last election for Board of Trustees was on 08 April 2015. The founding documents provide for a two year term for the Board of Trustees. Clause 12.1 of Al Ansaar Durban's Memorandum of Association provides for Directors to be elected every two years. Therefore, the next elective AGM will be in 2017.9

The Licensee was found to be compliant with clause 3.2 and its sub-clauses of the schedule to the licence.

3.4 Programming

Clause 4.1.1 of the schedule to the licence stipulates that the Licensee shall provide format as follows:

"80% talk and 20% music".

The Licensee has confirmed that it broadcasts in the prescribed format.

The monitoring exercise revealed that Al-Ansaar Durban broadcasts 20% music and 80% talk. This in line with clause 4.1.1 of the schedule to its licence conditions.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with clause 4.1.1 of the schedule to its licence.

Clause 4.1.2.1 of the schedule to the licence stipulates that:

"The Licensee shall broadcast a total of 100 minutes of news per day, of which 60% shall be local news generated from the community, 20% shall be national and 15% international news. News shall be broadcast in English".

The Licensee submits that it broadcasts 15 news bulletins per day on weekdays. Al Ansaar Radio states that its news bulletin's duration is 7 minutes. ¹⁰ The monitoring exercise confirmed that Al-Ansaar Durban Radio broadcasts 15 news bulletins per day. The news bulletins are 7 minutes in duration. In total, the Licensee broadcsts 105 minutes of news per day.

Among the news stories covered for the period under review were excerpts from certain broadcasts, as follows:

- "Six people have been arrested in the Mbongolwane area near Eshowe in connection with the murders of two KZN police officers";
- "The University of Johannesburg prepares to take on 10500 new students";
- "The Social Development Department Councilling service has received an increasing number of requests for assistance from young people ahead the release of matric results announcement today"; and
- "The heatwave that has been experienced throught the country in recent weeks has seen a number of incidents where people had had to receive medication for heat stroke".

The Licensee was found to be compliant with clause 4.1.2.1 of the schedule to the licence.

Clause 4.1.2.2 of the schedule to the licence stipulates that:

"Current affairs shall be broadcast from Monday to Friday for (30) minutes. On Wednesday it will be broadcast in the evening for one hour thirty minutes (1hour 30

minutes) and on Saturday it will be broadcast for one hour fifteen minutes (1hour 15 minutes)".

The Licensee states that current affairs programmes are broadcast from Mondays to Fridays. Al Ansaar Durban states that the duration for current affairs programmes is 30 minutes. The currents affairs programmes are broadcast during the programmes called "Morning Rush" and "Drive Home Experience". The Licensee states that the "Bottom Line" is broadcast on Wednesday for a duration of 90 minutes (1 hour 30 minutes). Further, Radio Al Ansaar Durban broadcasts a current affairs programme on Saturdays called "The Big Picture" from 11h30 – 13h00 and "Behind The Mic" from 21h00 to 22h30. The monitoring confirmed that the Licensee broadcasts current affairs programmes on weekdays and Saturdays.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with clause 4.1.2.2 of the schedule to its licence.

Clause 4.1.3.1 of the schedule to the licence stipulates that:

"The Licensee shall broadcast a minimum Of 45% South African music".

The Licensee confirms that it broadcasts local music. According to the Licensee, this music is sourced from South Africa in various languages, which include English, Arabic, Zulu, Xhosa and Urdu.

The monitoring confirmed that the radio station broadcasts local music as required by clause 4.1.3.1 of the schedule to its licence. The music artists whose music is played by the radio station include Waheed, Zain Bhikha, Tariq Uwais Malinga, Aspire, Faeeza Malinga and Khuddam Al Islam. At least 45% South African music was monitored.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with clause 4.1.3.1 of the schedule to its licence.

Clause 4.1.3.2 of the schedule to the licence stipulates that:

"The Licensee shall broadcast programmes that show case local Muslim artists and perfomers, reciters (naath, nazms, anasheed and that of the Qurra (professional reciters of the Holy Quran) and broadcast upcoming bands and performers or those not recorded or distributed by major record companies".

Radio Al Ansaar states that "The Dawud Show"; "Sana E Muhammad"; "The Nasheed Café"; "The Breakfast Rush"; "Tazklyah"; Bazme Adab; "The Ali Café" and "The Afternoon Rush" are shows that focus on interviewing and showcasing Muslim artists from the local music scene. During the shows, the music of upcoming bands and performers, and those not recorded or distributed by major record companies is broadcast.

The monitoring exercise confirmed that the radio station broadcasts the above mentioned programmes.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with clause 4.1.3.2 of the schedule to the licence.

Clause 4.1.4 of the schedule to the licence stipulates that Language(s) of broadcast are as follows:

- "(a) 80% English;
- (b) 10% isiZulu;
- (c) 5% Arabic; and
- (d) 5% Urdu".

The Licensee states that 80% of the broadcast is in English; 10% in isiZulu; 5% in Urdu and 5% in Arabic. This was further confirmed during the monitoring exercise that the radio station complies with the language requirement.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with clause 4.1.4 of the schedule to its licence conditions.

Clause 5.1.1 of the schedule to the licence stipulates that:

"The Licensee shall teach, train, and assist interested members of the community how to produce programmes and provide facilities to learn and practice the technical and aesthetic aspects of radio".

The Licensee submits that workshops and training on broadcasting regarding how to produce programmes were provided to the community members and various NGOs. Further, Radio Al Ansaar-Durban submitted proof of the aforesaid training to the Authority.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with clause 5.1.1 of the schedule to its licence.

Clause 5.1.2 of the schedule to the licence states that:

"The Licensee shall set up a listener's forum comprising of a variety of suburbs or zones in the broadcast area".

The Licensee states that a listener's forum comprising a variety of suburbs or zones was setup to encourage listeners to provide feedback on programming. The Licensee submitted proof of the meetings.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with clause 5.1.2 of the schedule to its licence.

Clause 5.1.3 of the schedule to the licence stipulates that:

"The Licensee shall ensure that other ways of feedback from the community shall be considered as well, such as various means of the social media, faxes, telephone and letters".

According to the Licensee, the community is aware of many channels to contact the radio station. The Licensee states that the radio station broadcasts advert at various times which mentions the various ways to contact the radio station. These ways include contact via telephone, email, mail, social media, whatsapp and via website.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with clause 5.1.3 of the schedule to its licence.

4. REGULATIONS

4.1 Complaints Received

The Licensee is required, in terms of the Compliance Procedure Manual Regulations, to submit a Form 12A¹¹ which reports on all complaints received during the financial year under review.

For the year under review, the Licensee reported that it did not receive complaints from its listeners or any member of the public.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with the Compliance Procedure Manual Regulations

4.2 South African Music Content Regulations¹²

Regulation 3.3 of the Regulations on South African Music Content as published on 31 January 2006 stipulates that:

"Every holder of a community sound broadcasting licence to which these regulations apply must ensure that after eighteen months of the gazetting of these regulations, a minimum of 40% of the musical works broadcast in the performance period consist of South African music and that such South African music is spread reasonably evenly throughout the said period".

The monitoring confirmed that Al Ansaar Radio broadcasts above 45% of local music per day. This music is sourced from South Africa in various languages, which include English, Arabic, Zulu, Xhosa and Urdu.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with the Regulations on South African Music Content.

4.3 Regulations Regarding Standard Terms and Conditions for Class Broadcasting Licences¹³

During the year under review, the Authority did not identify instances of non-compliance by the Licensee with the standard terms and conditions for class licences.

The Licensee was found to be compliant with the Standard Terms and Conditions for Class Broadcasting Licences.

5. CONCLUSION

The Licensee was found to be compliant with all provisions of its licence conditions and applicable regulations. The compliance by Radio Al Ansaar-Durburn is a good example on how to comply with licence terms and conditions and other relevant regulations. The only concern is that the board of Al-Ansaar Durban is similar to Al-Ansaar Pietermaritsburg
