### PHAKISA LABS

LABS were established to implement an integrated ocean governance framework for sustainable growth of the ocean economy to maximise socio-economic benefits whilst ensuring adequate ocean environmental protection within the next 5 years:

- Offshore Oil and Gas Exploration
- Marine Transport and Manufacturing
- Aquaculture
- Marine Protection Services and Governance
- Small Craft Harbours and Coastal Development and Tourism

### **OBJECTIVES – INITIATIVE 5**

- Co-ordination required for enforcement and policing of coasts and oceans
- Need to improve monitoring, control and surveillance
- Identification and protection of sensitive and unique marine habitats and species
- Limited human and financial resources to manage and protect oceans and coastal resources – NEED TO JOIN FORCES
- Need to address the high level of Illegal, Unreported and Unregulated
  Fishing Activities (IUU) in addition to other illegal activities



The enforcement initiative will optimise enforcement assets from all relevant departments, agencies and provinces, whilst leveraging on the Security Cluster Programme for the necessary Security Assessments



### COMPLIANCE AND ENFORCEMENT FOCUS AREAS

- Non-consumptive activity, e.g. whale watching and white shark cage diving
- Marine protected species (seals, seabirds, turtles, penguins etc.)
- Marine Protected Areas (MPAs)
- Illegal fishing
- Pollution prevention and combatting
- Piracy
- Human trafficking
- Effluent discharge (contaminated water)
- Dumping at sea (waste)
- Customs/excise/sanitary rules
- Ballast water invasive species



### PROGRESS/ACHIEVEMENTS

- Complete Pilot Phase September 2015 to March 2016
- Compliance and Enforcement Working Group established
- Inter-Departmental/Agency Workplan developed and endorsed by the Working Group
- NATJOINTS Operational Instructions Pilot Phase and the next financial year
- Joint operations based on the Workplan targets have been conducted with successes in terms of cases registered, fines, confiscations and arrests.

### **CHALLENGES**

- Communication between role-players involved in the operations
- Lack of a generic portable two-way radio system to which all role players could have access
- As a result there was a noticeable poor communication, especially when local authorities or provincial departments were involved in operation
- Inability to release officials with adequate equipment
- Budget



### RECOMMENDATIONS

- It is recommended that ICASA makes a frequency band available for government departments in the UHF band for use by Compliance and Enforcement Working Group under Initiative 5 of Phakisa as well as where other national joint operations are taking place
- It is also recommended that ICASA takes note of the importance of creating or availing the frequency band for specifically operations related to Operation Phakisa as this is a Presidential project that is coordinated at National Joints Office to ensure full participation of all Law Enforcement Departments and Agencies within South Africa
- It is further requested that the frequency band allocated for Phakisa be exempted from annual licence fees. Reason: there is no operational budget set aside for this Initiative as the project is about coordinating different Departments/Institutions
