

Schedule 2 Sub-Clause 2.2 – Languages

- 12.3 Sub-Clause 2.2 reads as follows: "The Licensee shall broadcast a minimum of two (2) hours of news and information programming per week during the performance period in a wide range of official languages other than English and shall make provision for sign language translation on screen during the prime time news bulletin. In complying with its obligations in respect of the use of official languages other than English, the Licensee shall not make excessive use of a single language, other than English, to the exclusion of other official languages."
- 12.4 e.tv further proposes to add the following words at the end of subclause 2.2 to read as follows: "The Licensee shall broadcast a minimum of two (2) hours of news and information programming per week during the performance period in a wide range of official languages other than English and shall make provision for sign language translation on screen during the prime time news bulletin. In complying with its obligations in respect of the use of official languages other than English, the Licensee shall not make excessive use of a single language, other than English, to the exclusion of other official languages <u>shall be measured across all</u> channels broadcast in terms of this Licence."

Schedule 2 Sub-Clause 2.3 – Languages

- 12.5 Sub-Clause 2.3 reads as follows: "The Licensee shall broadcast four (4) hours of programming other than news and information per week in official languages other than English. Compliance with this sub-clause shall be measured accordingly over the licence year. In complying with the above obligations, the Licensee shall not make excessive use of a single language, other than English, to the exclusion of the other official languages."
- 12.6 e.tv further proposes to add the following words at the end of subclause 2.2 to read as follows: "The Licensee shall broadcast four (4) hours of programming other than news and information per week in official languages other than English. Compliance with this sub-clause shall be measured accordingly over the licence year. In complying with the above obligations, the Licensee shall not make excessive use of a single language, other than English, to the exclusion of the other official languages <u>shall be measured across</u> <u>all channels broadcast in terms of this Licence.</u>"

Schedule 2 Clause 5 – Information Programming

- 12.7 Clause 5 reads as follows: "The Licensee shall broadcast at least nineteen (19) hours of information programming per week, at least two (2) hours of which shall be broadcast during prime time."
- 12.8 e.tv further proposes to add the following words at the end of existing Clause 5 to read as follows: "The Licensee shall broadcast at least nineteen (19) hours of information programming per week, at least two (2) hours of which shall be broadcast during prime time. The measurement of the obligations set out herein shall be measured across all channels broadcast in terms of this Licence."

Schedule 2 Sub-Clause 6.2 – News and Current Affairs

- 12.9 Sub-Clause 6.2 reads as follows: "The Licensee shall broadcast at least two (2) hours of news programming during the performance period, of which at least thirty (30) minutes, packaged as a single programme, shall be broadcast during prime time."
- 12.10 e.tv further proposes to add the following words at the end of Sub-Clause 6.2 to read as follows: "The Licensee shall broadcast at least two (2) hours of news programming during the performance period, of which at least thirty (30) minutes, packaged as a single programme, shall be broadcast during prime time. <u>The Licensee shall make provision for sign language translation on screen during the prime time news bulletin.</u>"

Schedule 2 Sub-Clause 7.2 – Programming targeted at children.

- 12.11 Sub-Clause 7.2 reads as follows: "The Licensee shall broadcast the children's programming referred to in sub-clause (a) above, between the hours of 13h00 and 18h00 on weekdays and between 07h00 and 13h00 on weekends, provided that:"
- 12.12 e.tv further proposes to amend and substitute certain wording of Sub-Clause 7.2 to read as follows: "The Licensee shall broadcast the children's programming referred to in sub-clause <u>7.1</u> above, <u>at appropriate times for children</u>, provided that:

(i)....″

12.13 e.tv also seeks amendment to add a new sub-clause to be numbered sub-clause 7.4 after sub-clause 7.3 to read as follows:

7.4 "The measurement of the obligations set out in this clause 7, shall be measured across all channels broadcast in terms of this Licence."

Schedule Clause 8 – Limitations on Advertising and Provision of Advertising-related Information.

12.14 Clause 8.1 reads as follows: "The Licensee may not broadcast:

- (a) more than an average of ten (10) minutes of advertisements per hour on the licensed service during any licence year, and
- (b) advertisements in excess of twelve (12) minutes in any one hour."
- 12.15 e.tv proposes the deletion of clause 8 in its entirety and that there be re-numbering of the existing clauses 9 and 10 to 8 and 9 respectively.

Schedule Clause 10 – Skills and development obligations.

- 12.16 Clause 10 reads as follows: "The Licensee must invest 5.5% of its total annual salary cost escalating annually at the rate of inflation, in staff training."
- 12.17 e.tv proposes the deletion of clause 10 in its entirety and substituted it with the following:
 - "9.1 The Licensee must adopt and implement equal opportunity employment practices.
 - 9.2 The Licensee must ensure that its management and staff are representative of South African society and that its human resources policies take into account the development and training of managerial, production, technical and other skills and expertise, particularly with regard to historically disadvantaged persons.
 - 9.3 The Licensee shall endeavour to achieve fair and reasonable participation by historically disadvantaged persons following suitable training with respect to:
 - (i) its management and control structure;
 - (ii) skills development;
 - (iii) enterprise development; and
 - (iv) procurement.

9.4 The Licensee shall report to the Authority at the time when its annual compliance report is complied, the training undertaken by it for the previous year to reflect what training it has done for purposes of skills and enterprise development."
