We want to sincerely commend the Authority for its view that there is NO indication of ineffective competition in the sector







The PSL has been consistent in our assertion that the process for the sale of our broadcasting rights is competitive







It is a process that encourages all broadcasters and interested parties to participate in the PSL's tender processes for our rights







The fact that some chose not to do so, and after the completion of the processes, to then cry foul, was disingenuous







We welcome the Authority's recognition in the Supplementary Discussion Document that any provider interested in the PSL's rights had the opportunity to bid for the rights when we issued the tenders







It is market forces that have corrected the historical problem of the under-valuation of PSL broadcasting rights








We have since been able to grow our content, and through this we are able to support a multitude of stakeholders in South African soccer
