PROJECT ISIZWE SUBMISSION ON THE INQUIRY FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE RADIO FREQUENCY MIGRATION PLAN AND OF THE INTERNATIONAL MOBILE TELECOMMUNICATIONS ROADMAP

Introduction

- 1. Free WiFi for Africa NPC TA Project Isizwe is a South African NGO advocating for and deploying free and subsidized public WiFi zones.
- 2. Project Isizwe has been in existence since 2013 and deployed the largest free WiFi project in Africa in the Tshwane municipality.
- 3. Project Isizwe currently operates 15 networks across 8 provinces in South Africa.
- Project Isizwe currently delivers 60 TB of data a month of free or subsidized WiFi saving over 100 000 citizens of South Africa approximately R150 million a year in data costs.
- 5. Project Isizwe uses wireless internet service providers who are members of the Wireless Access Providers Association (WAPA) with preference to black owned providers to deliver public WiFi zones

The importance of the International mobile Telecommunications Roadmap

- 6. Currently only 9.1% of homes in South Africa have fixed broadband.
- 7. Those 90.9% reliant only on mobile connection have to pay up to 100 times more for data than those who have fixed broadband (WiFi at home).
- 8. South Africa currently ranks 111th globally in terms of fixed broadband penetration.
- 9. South Africa's economy ranks 32nd globally and 92nd in terms of GDP per capita.
- 10. Equitable connectivity of all citizens is critical to prevent the South African economy from dropping in global ranking.
- 11. South Africa needs to focus on improving fixed broadband penetration as a matter of urgency to avoid 90% of the citizens missing out on the 4th Industrial revolution.
- 12. To this end, Project Isizwe advocates that spectrum preference be given to SMME's that roll out fixed broadband for the implementation of the radio frequency migration plan.

- 13. WAPA is an industry body that assure legal compliance and a level of quality of members that meet the requirements of Project Isizwe for rolling out further networks.
- 14. WAPA provides an equal platform for all members to bid on new opportunities developed by Project Isizwe
- 15. The WAPA operational team provide world class advice and training particularly to black owned SMME's entering the market
